The PMI Certification Program maintains ISO 9001 certification in Quality Management Systems as evidence of its commitment to professional excellence.

If you enjoy the prestige that comes from being the best in your field, then you'll appreciate the professional advantages derived from attaining the PMP. PMP certification is the profession's most globally recognized and respected certification credential. The PMP designation following your name tells current and potential employers that you have a solid foundation of project management knowledge that can be readily applied in the workplace.

To be eligible for the PMP certification, you must first meet specific education and experience requirements and agree to adhere to a code of professional conduct. The final step in becoming a PMP is passing a multiple-choice examination designed to objectively assess and measure your project management knowledge. This computer-based examination is administered globally.

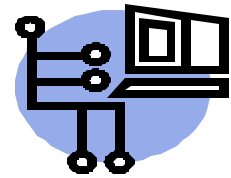

How Does the Class Work?

On Sunday of each week, the instructor will:

- Open the week's "module" This is a web page that contains all the material for that week. Prompt / start new discussion items in the class forum that deal with the material we'll cover.

On Monday through Thursday you should

- Read the module material. Read the PMBOK® guide chapter. Read my "lecture". Work on the sample PMP® exam questions for the module. Respond to several discussion items. Respond to several other students' responses (I will too). Review what sample PMP® questions you missed -- if any. Ask / discuss the answers.

By Friday you should

- Slow down on the discussions. Complete the sample PMP® questions and Email me your answers. Get a corrected copy and the answer key back from me.

On Saturday and Sunday you must

- Do as little as possible. Catch up if you've slipped behind during the week.

Module 3: Project Time Management, Network Diagramming

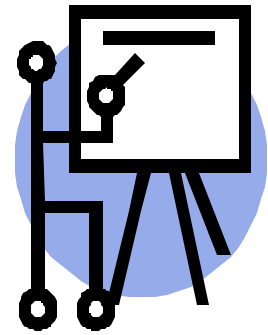

What Do I Need to Get for the Class?

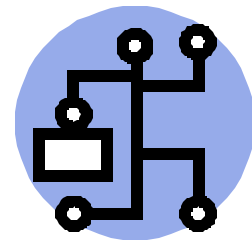
Not very much. We've tried to keep student costs low at every opportunity .

For the text, the class will use the PMBOK® Guide 2000 edition. This is available from the PMI bookstore. (<http://www.pmi.org>). Also, it's best to download a copy of PMI's PMP® certification handbook. You'll need it!

You'll need access to the Internet and the typical Microsoft Office™ suite. The most often used application are MS Word® and PowerPoint®. The lectures and most of the documents are stored as Adobe PDF®, so you'll need Adobe Reader® too (a free download at <http://www.adobe.com>).

Throughout the class, you'll be printing a lot of material! The lectures, chapter questions, additional material presentations and more. When the class ends, you'll have printed (and hopefully read) enough documents to fill a 3 ½" binder. Daily access to a printer is almost a necessity.
