Jim Anderson, Director of the Fort Wayne Children's Zoo, talked about a current project to transform the 30-year old African Veldt into a new exhibit called the "African Journey".

This \$8.5 million project will be the largest effort ever undertaken by the Zoo. Key results of the project are a modest expansion of the zoo grounds and a major transformation of the current exhibit into an immersion of African sights, sounds, animals, and culture.

The most amazing observation that many of those in attendance had was the fact that this huge effort is being made without a large project team of employees, and without any formal project management techniques! Jim did explain, however, the large amount of time had been invested in research and planning through discussions with other zoos and the construction contractors.

Jim acknowledged the recent announcement of a "leading gift" of \$1.1 million from the Lincoln Financial Group Foundation toward a new, state-of-the-art giraffe exhibit. Many of our Chapter members are employees of LFG.

Thanks to Jim for his interesting presentation about a local community asset. We offer him and his team our best wishes on their project!
